Makerspace Critters

Materials Needed:

- Computer & Printer & Paper to Download & Print your Critters.
 - pdf files are available to download in Full Color or B&W that kids can color.
- Scissors
- Glue stick

Basic folding instructions for the critter's body

Step 1: Using white letter size paper, PRINT out the Critter.



Step 2: Cut out the critter's body pieces. The main body of every critter is a square. Make sure you keep the "glue here" pieces.

Lay the extra body pieces aside for now, as only the large square body piece will be used in the next several steps.

Step 3: Fold Up & Down. With the printed/color side facing down, fold the bottom section up until it touches the top, literally folding your square in half. Then unfold.



Step 4: Fold Left & Right.
With the printed/color side facing down, fold the left side over until it touches the right, folding your square in half. Then unfold.




Step 5: Fold Diagonally. With the printed/color side facing down, fold the paper diagonally until the bottom

right hand side touches the top left hand side. Then unfold.



Step 6: Fold Diagonally.
With the printed/color side facing down, fold the paper diagonally again until the

bottom left hand side touches the top right hand side. Then unfold.





Step 8: Flip & Fold Corners.
Flip the paper over so the printed/color side faces down.
Then fold all four corners up and into the center point again.



Step 9: Fold In Half.
Fold the square in half.
Left to Right OR Top to
Bottom it doesn't matter.



Step 10: Gently Fold In.
Carefully tuck your thumbs
and forefingers in the four
openings, and gently push the

four corners into the center point to form the critter body.



Step 11: Use your glue stick to attach all the extra body pieces to the basic body.


*Optional is to put a little bit of glue in the center fold seam on top and bottom so that your critter's mouth will only open in one direction.








*Note: When attaching the hair tuft to the body: it fits better if you cut a small 1/2" slit into the zebras' body and slide the hair tuft in between. Color the hair tuft on both sides; and then glue it down.
