




# The Price of Salmon

Use the data you collected to make a **bar graph** showing the results.




## YOU WON'T BELIEVE WHO I MET!

# FINN McCOOL PIECES IN THE FINN McCOOL PIE



#### IRISH SODA BREAD RECIPE

Pretend you are Finn McCool and enjoy making and eating this popular Irish bread.

#### **Ingredients**

1¾ cup buttermilk

1 egg

4 cups unbleached flour

1 teaspoon baking soda

1 tablespoon baking powder

1 teaspoon salt

1 cup raisins- you can mix ½ golden raisins and half regular raisins or all of either type of raisin.

#### **Directions**

Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

Spray two 8-inch round cake pans with vegetable oil.

In a small bowl beat the buttermilk and egg, salt, and raisins.

In a large bowl combine flour, baking soda, and baking powder.

Add buttermilk and egg mixture to ingredients in the large bowl and stir.

Turn dough onto a floured board and knead dough until smooth.

Divide dough in half and press into cake pans.

Slash into pie wedges (this will make it easy to cut after it's baked).

Bake for 30-35 minutes or until golden brown.
