



Do you think there is any connection between how the illustrator chose to illustrate a creature and whether or not it was real or imaginary?


Can you tell from the poems which creatures are still alive?


Reread the poems and identify the clue that helps locate the hidden creature.

Of the Steller's Sea Cow"


